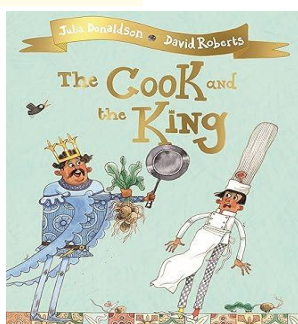
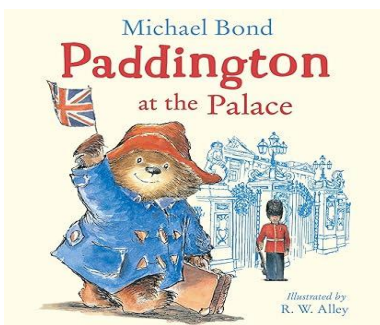

Reading

Please continue to ensure reading books and reading logs are in bags daily to assist in reading and changing books.

We aim to check for evidence of at least 3 ten-minute reads every week. Supporting adults should be recording this as a sentence or two explaining what they have read.



PE

We will be participating in PE on Tuesdays and Thursdays each week this half term.

Your child will need their PE kit in school for both of these days.

We will have a mixture of outdoor and indoor PE lesson therefore, children will need to ensure they are bringing in sensible kit for PE.

PE kit should include:

- A pair of trainers
- A pair of black shorts or plain sports bottoms
- PE t-shirt
- PE sweater
- Ear tape for pierced ears if required



Curriculum Learning

Here is some key information about what your children will be learning in school this half term. For our themed learning, we are moving onto a new theme topic 'Magnificent Monarchs'. This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and explore and present their findings in practical exciting ways.

We will also touch on the DT companion project 'Push and Pull' which teaches children about three types of mechanism: sliders, levers and linkages. They make models of each mechanism before designing and making a greetings card with a moving part.

There is definitely lots of exciting fun in our themed learning to look forward to.

Across the rest of our curriculum, we have other skills and knowledge sessions to develop and inspire us. Computing will see us looking at the terms Programming of algorithms and debugging. In Music, we will be learning about Orchestral Instruments via the theme of Traditional Stories. BRAVE will develop our knowledge around areas of Judaism, where we will be investigating 'Why do Jewish families talk about repentance at New Year?'

In English, we will be writing a mixture of story writing, poems and comic strip narratives. 'Paddington at the Palace' text will be the first text to inspire some of our writing outcomes this term.

We will be consolidating and expanding our knowledge and application of addition and subtraction but with numbers up to 100, as well as moving onto understanding multiplication and division in Maths.
