SWIMMING

SCHOOL MEALS ~ AUTUMN TERM 2024 ~ FIRST HALF

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The children are looking very smart in their uniforms, thank you so much for your support with this. It really helps with enhancing the children's sense of belonging and contributes to their attitude to their learning and work. Our uniform requirements are as follows:

HUNDON COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL

SCHOOL:

- Red sweatshirt, jumper, fleece or cardigan
- Grey or black trousers, skirt, shorts or dress
- White shirt
- Red/silver tie (in stock at school)
- Summer option: Red checked dress
- Plain socks / tights (red, grey, black, white)
- Suitable black outdoor footwear*
- Sunhats in summer

*When the weather is particularly warm we suggest the children wear flat, closed toe sandals for comfort.

PE:

PE KIT consists of

- Dark, plain shorts with elasticated waist (no zips please)
- Official Hundon PE shirt / plain T-shirt in white (no buttons or zips please)
- Trainers
- Plain tracksuit bottom and top (in winter / if cold)

SWIMMING KIT consists of

- A ONE PIECE swimming costume or pair of swimming shorts / trunks
- A towel
- A swimming hat
- Suitable footwear from the classroom to the pool. (e.g. flipflops / water shoes / crocs)

PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL SITE

We are sending this message to remind parents and carers of the importance of driving and parking safely around the school site. It is vital due care and attention for our school, our neighbours and other drivers is given.

Changes to School Attendance came into force from 19th August which includes higher fine costs and the Department for Education's (DfE) stance that a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation is not considered to be an exceptional circumstance.

As is the case for all schools we are obligated to follow the statutory guidance and regulations laid down by the DfE and in turn, the Local Authority. We have to follow this guidance and the fines are not received by schools.

Our attendance figures are closely scrutinised by the Local Authority as well as other professional bodies such as Ofsted. It is in our own best interests that all our children are at school on time and attend regularly, in order that they can take full advantage of the very best educational experiences and highest educational standards we are constantly striving to provide.

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance changed from 19th August 2024

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices issued by DfE, the following changes came into force for School Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Please note: The DfE does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.



Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.



Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case could be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in Criminal records and fines of up to £2,500

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court may show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Per Parent*, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent* for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

*Parent

Section 576 of the Education Act 1996 defines "parent" as:

- All natural (biological) parents, whether they are married or not.
- Any person who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility for a child or young person.
- Any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or young person.
